



IS EDDY LODGE PREPARED TO MEET THE MASONIC DEMANDS AND NEEDS OF THE MILLENNIAL GENERATION?





- The words Esoteric and Education were used many times in their responses to gaining knowledge.

Masonic Restoration Foundation Symposium Check your email for details and registration

Event:

The Masonic Restoration Foundation Symposium is the largest gathering of Masons in North America who are expressly committed to observing the highest standards of excellence in the Craft. This year we will be holding the Symposium in the Southwest, in the alluring desert atmosphere of Santa Fe, New Mexico.

The Symposium will take place from August 10-12, 2018 and will be hosted by Montezuma Lodge No. 1 and Cerrillos Lodge No. 19, with part of the event taking place at the adjacent Santa Fe Scottish Rite Building. As usual, the event will begin with a Harmony [Festive Board] held in the Dining Hall on Friday evening, conducted by the host Lodge, and featuring comments from our Keynote Speaker, prolific author and Worshipful Brother John Bizzack, Master of Lexington Lodge No. 1, in Lexington, Kentucky. Along with our usual lineup of interesting speakers, brothers will have the opportunity to attend a Master Mason degree on Saturday afternoon. Registration for the Symposium is \$125.00 USD, and \$75.00 USD for the Saturday session only. Brothers who wish to attend only the Friday night Harmony will pay \$50 USD.

We are hoping that this will be an opportunity for an exchange of different perspectives and methods of Masonic practice in North America. All the information you need to participate is found here on this web site. We look forward to seeing you at the Symposium!

Dress Code for the Symposium:

The Harmony on Friday evening will be formal (tuxedo is preferred, but black suit and black tie will be acceptable). Saturday all attendees are required to wear dark suit and tie. No casual wear will be permitted during the Symposium. As the tyled lodge is taking place during the day, either morning dress or dark suit and tie are appropriate. The Sunday session will be more relaxed, however, the Grand Master of Masons in New Mexico will be addressing the Symposium, so brethren are expected to dress accordingly.

Lodging:

After years of offering a group rate at a "Symposium hotel", this year we are simply making suggestions for accommodations. While the attendance at Symposiums is consistently strong, we have found that at the last two events, brethren did not make use of the group rate hotel option to the degree that would justify our offering it again. So, this time, we are taking advantage of the smaller size of Santa Fe (in terms of getting around) and the independent-mindedness of our participants, to let you find your own way.

The following hotels are recommended for your convenience: [In order of their proximity to the Temple]:

1, Drury Plaza Hotel, 2. La Posada De Santa Fe, 3. Inn on the Alameda, 4. Hilton Santa Fe Historic Plaza, 5. Eldorado Hotel and Spa.

We are, however, offering twenty rooms at the Scottish Rite Center for \$25.00/night. These rooms are double occupancy, dormitory-style, and are first come first serve. If you're interested in these admittedly spartan accommodations, please contact Scott Jaquith [scottjaquith@gmail.com] about reserving your space there. All hotels are within a five-minute drive/fifteen minute walk from the temple.
